Premier's Reading Challenge

I am delighted to invite all students to join in the 2024 Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC). The PRC is not a competition but a way to encourage students to develop a love of reading for life. Students are encouraged to select a range of fiction and non-fiction books suited to their reading ability and record books read during the reading period, from 7 May to 23 August. Attached to this newsletter is a reader record form to tally book read throughout the challenge.

To complete the challenge:

Prep to Year 2 must read or experience at least 20 books Years 3 and 4 must read at least 20 books

Years 5 to 9 must read at least 15 books.

Experiencing books can include shared reading, listening to stories, or reading picture books. The aim for the 2024 challenge is to encourage students to make time to read. Last year saw more than 110,000 children from around the state participate.

Every student who completes the challenge, and returns the completed record reader form, will receive a Certificate of Achievement signed by the Premier of Queensland. I look forward to seeing as many of our students as possible take part in the 2024 Premier's Reading Challenge. You can play a big part in your children's future by encouraging them to be part of this positive initiative. Maths Games and Olympiad – Year 5/6

This year we have committed our Year 5/6 students to undertaking both a Maths Games and Maths Olympiad competition which will commence during our Maths lessons next week. This is held over a number of months and includes 5 rounds of complex problem-solving activities. It is a great opportunity for students to see why they need their numeracy skills so much to solve real-world problems and some very abstract mathematical problems also!

Hermitage Schools Plant Science – Aquaponics vs Traditional Agriculture

If you haven't seen it yet, make sure you check-out the Aquaponics food production system that the students are running at school this term. We have planted many 'food-producing' seedlings in the system that also has 50 Silver Perch growing in the base tanks. The plant health and productivity are being compared with the same seedling growing in our traditional garden beds at the back of the school to see which system produced the most food and what efficiencies exist in both systems.

Central Downs Gala Day 1 – Friday Week 6 (24 May 24) Students from the Year 3-6 class are involved in the Central Downs Gala Days at the Allora State P-10 School, the first of which is marring on Friday of Work 6 and the second day

of which is running on Friday of Week 6 and the second day is the Friday of Week 8. These days are the Central Downs School Sport way of running interschool sport instead of the traditional Friday afternoon sport that stills runs in many schools in town. The competition on this day will run from 9:30-2:30 and forms for those students who are attending will be sent home today. We will have students competing throughout the day as either a combination of students from our school or a combined team with other small schools from our cluster. Parents are welcome to come and support our students but there is no expectation for parents to attend. If there are any queries please contact me when you get the chance.

Finally, we have attached a Meal Deal form for Under 8s Day which is a special event for all children in our wider Clifton Cluster aged 8 or under. We will have further details in the newsletter as the event approaches, but the organisers from Clifton State School have requested that the meals are pre-ordered by the 24th of May. These forms can be returned to school as soon as possible and we will collate our school order.
